The Implementation Specialist position supports two projects funded by the California Department of Social Services. The Advancing California's Trauma-Informed Systems (ACTS) project partners with child welfare counties to implement and sustain trauma-informed change practices, and the Trauma-Informed Licensing Team (TILT) project works with the Children's Residential division of Community Care Licensing to advance trauma-informed organizational change.

**Job Summary:** The Implementation Specialist plays a key role in developing collaborative relationships with individuals and organizations at the county, state, or national level to develop, adapt, evaluate, and disseminate trauma-informed care practices. This specialist will also help to disseminate grant-related information through presentations, writing, and publication. He/she/they will provide training and technical assistance and advocate on a state and national level on practices informed by the available research related to prevention and/or intervention, with particular focus on trauma-informed care. He/she/they also participates in creating key products and/or written materials related to grant deliverables and works with others on the team to meet reporting and monitoring requirements and grant required deadlines. It is ideal that this individual will have strong content expertise related to trauma-informed care.

- Master's degree
- Strong organizational skills and the ability to establish priorities manage multiple demands and projects and meet deadlines
- Ability to work collaboratively and build relationships across systems as well as with community partners
